

"Everyone who acknowledges Me before others, I will acknowledge before My Father in heaven."

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus calls His disciples and us to bear witness to Him before all people and to "speak in the light," "to proclaim it from the rooftops," and to "fear no one." But, in our Covid-19 circumstances, how are we called to acknowledge Our Lord before others, and merit His promise to acknowledge us to His Heavenly Father? As we all know so well, we proclaim the Gospel message to others, not only by outright evangelization, but by the witness of our lives. Many may recall a photograph widely circulated online at the start of the pandemic shut-down of a priest, fully-vested, who walked across the cross-shaped roof of his church in Paris, carrying a golden monstrance exposing Our Lord in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist as he blessed the city below in the brilliant light of day. May we be inspired by his example to bear witness to the Lord in doing all we can within our particular limited circumstances! May we, too, rise to every occasion to "speak in the light," "to proclaim our faith from the rooftops" and to "fear no one," secure in Christ's promise to acknowledge us to His Father in heaven. ~ K.N-C.



Liturgy Notes by Justin Soutar:

On this Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, our Scripture readings exhort the righteous who are unjustly persecuted to trust in God's protection and deliverance. The embattled prophet Jeremiah declares that the Lord will rescue him from the grasp of the wicked. Saint Paul explains to the Romans that the tyranny of sin and death ushered in by Adam was conquered by Christ. And in the Gospel, Jesus urges his apostles not to be afraid of those who will persecute them for preaching the Word of God.

"Being a Christian has nothing to do with social status, it is not a lifestyle that makes one feel good; being a Christian means being a witness of obedience and the life of a Christian is full of insults and persecutions" (Pope Francis, Homily, 4/27/17). May our unswerving fidelity to Christ and the Church amid a radically secularist culture be an attractive witness to our fellow men and women.


