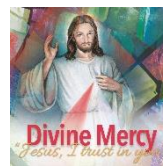

**From the Director of Religious Education,  
Kathleen Nowacki-Correia:**

*“That He had to rise from the dead.”*

On Easter Sunday, we rejoice that the Cross of Good Friday has brought us to the Resurrection of the Lord. As the Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen preached many decades ago in his Collection of Lent and Easter Wisdom, “The Cross had asked the questions; the Resurrection had answered them. The Cross had asked, “Why does God permit Evil and Sin to nail Justice to a tree?” The Resurrection answered: “That Sin, having done its worst, might exhaust itself and thus be overcome by Love that is stronger than either Sin or Death.” Indeed, Sheen’s preaching is supported by St. John Chrysostom in words inspired by the writings of St. Paul: “O Death, where is your sting? O Hell, where is your victory? Christ is risen, and you are overthrown. Christ is risen, and the demons are fallen. Christ is risen, and the angels rejoice. Christ is risen, and life reigns. Christ is risen, and not one dead remains in the grave. For Christ, being risen from the dead, is become the first fruits of those, who have fallen asleep. To Him, be glory and dominion unto ages of ages!” May every individual, who believes in the Risen Lord, offer Him supreme gratitude and praise, for in the words of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, “Faith in the Resurrection of Jesus says that there is a future for every human being—that the cry for unending life, which is a part of each person, is indeed answered.” As faithful disciples of the Risen Lord, may we go forth to celebrate and proclaim, “This is the day the Lord has made! Let us rejoice and be glad!” Happy Easter! ~ K.N-C.

**Liturgy Notes by Justin Soutar:**

+++ He Is Risen! Alleluia! +++

*“The stone which the builders rejected  
has become the cornerstone” (Ps. 118:22).*



On this Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord, the Church solemnly celebrates Christ’s glorious victory over sin, death, and Satan, repeatedly singing “Alleluia!” which means, “Praise the Lord!” The rich banquet of liturgical and

Scriptural texts for this festive occasion reveals in this great paradox of Divine Providence, that the One condemned to death by the religious leaders of his own nation became the source of eternal life for all believers. At the Easter Vigil, Saint Paul explains to the Christians of Rome that they have entered into the Paschal Mystery of Christ’s death and resurrection through Baptism. At this morning’s Masses, Saint Peter declares that “everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name” (Acts 10:43). Saint Paul exhorts the Colossian Christians to focus on the eternal realities in which they have been called to share. And in John’s Gospel narrative, Mary Magdalene, Peter, and John are surprised to find Jesus’ tomb open and vacant, the burial cloths left behind.

“And this is the grandeur of the love of Jesus: he gives His life freely to make us saints, to renew us, to forgive us... In the Paschal Triduum the memory of this fundamental event becomes a full celebration of gratitude and, at the same time, it renews in the baptized the sense of their new condition... Look up, look at the horizon, widen the horizons: this is our faith, this is our justification, this is the state of grace! Through Baptism, in fact, we are raised with Jesus and we die to the things and the logic of the world; we are reborn as new creatures... We have risen with Jesus: standing, and with our head held high, we can share the humiliation of those that still today, as Jesus, are in suffering, in nakedness, in necessity, in loneliness, in death, to become, thanks to Him and with Him, instruments of rescue and of hope, signs of life and of resurrection” (Pope Francis, General Audience, 3/28/18). May the joyful truth of Christ’s Resurrection strengthen and renew us in faith, hope, and love during this Octave of Easter and throughout the Easter season.

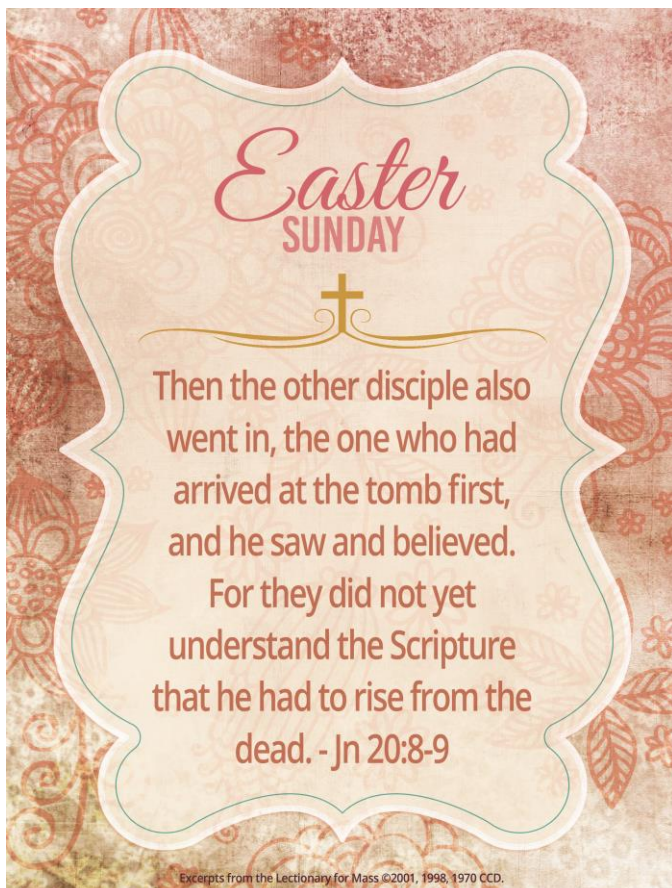
